## PPM 510-1 IV REVISIONS SUMMARY May 17, 2017

- PPM 510-1 Section IV describes the categories of authorized users of University Properties, specifically space and campus services. Authorized users, as delineated in the policy, include, but are not limited to, Registered Student Organizations, Registered Campus Organizations, and External Agencies.
- The University is proposing a set of changes to the Registered Student Organizations subsection of this policy (Subsection H). The main purposes for the changes are to add language regarding Cooperative Registered Student Organizations and unify Registered Student Organization policy.
- Subsection H contains new language specific to Cooperative Registered Student Organizations ("co-ops"). The language reflects the unique nature, purpose, and composition of these groups.
- The subsection also contains language alleviating current conflicts with the Registered Student Organizations Policy of the Student Conduct Regulations. Revisions approved to that policy during last year's comment period are being included in the PPM to create a unified registered student organizations policy. After the current revision process, the Registered Student Organizations Policy will be rescinded, thereby eliminating policy conflicts and confusion as to which policy takes precedence.
- Technical edits have also been made to the document in order to update outdated policy references, procedures, terms, and responsible positions. Additionally, the following sections have been revised or deleted to reflect current policy or protocol:
  - Registered Organizations General Information
    - Letter G(3) Coordination (this is an outdated practice)
  - Registered Campus Organizations
    - Letter I(2) Registration Procedures (updated per current protocol)
  - o Non-Profit, Profit, Promotion, Contract, and External Agencies
    - Letter M(4) Guidelines (updated per current campus protocol)
    - Letter M(6) Procedures (updated per current campus protocol)
    - Letter M(7) Exceptions (updated per University Communications policy)
