## A. INTRODUCTION & SCOPE OF POLICY

### **1. Introduction**

The University operates its campus, facilities and other property to meet its teaching, research and public service missions. The University is committed to providing an environment conducive to study and intellectual inquiry and to the co-curricular, administrative and business activities that support that environment. To assure a proper educational environment, the University must provide a campus that is safe, secure, and productive for its students, faculty, and staff. In addition, the University is committed to upholding the constitutionally protected freedom of speech and assembly. The University is also committed to preserving the dignity of University ceremonies and events and to respecting the rights of all individuals. The time, place and manner of exercising constitutionally protected rights of free speech and assembly on University property, whether verbally or through physical expression or the distribution, posting or exhibition of materials or through other lawful means of expression, are made subject to this Policy in order to prevent the interference with University business, functions or activities.

### **2. Scope of Policy**

This Policy, PPM Section 510-1 (herein, the “**Policy**”) sets forth the permissible uses of University property for expressive activity. This Policy supersedes all prior policies embracing the same subject matter and is applicable to all persons present on University property.

### **3. Conflicts of Policy**

In the event of conflict, policies from the University of California Office of the President shall take precedence over this Policy, and this Policy shall take precedence over all other UCSD campus policies regarding expressive activity. UCSD student policies (including

## C. GENERAL POLICY PROVISIONS

Capitalized terms used in this Policy and not defined herein are defined in Section 510-1 Section I (**insert website for that Section here once Section is issued**).

### 1. Designated Public Forums

The University hereby designates the portions of its campus identified in **Exhibit A** as public forums for the exercise of legally protected rights of free expression. In addition, outdoor areas that are (i) not otherwise regulated, (ii) at least 25 feet from the entrances or exits of University buildings and parking lots, and (iii) a safe distance from the curbing of campus roads are also hereby designated as public forums, with the exception of Program space, such as athletic fields, Price Center Plaza and Library Walk, which are subject to separate rules and regulations governing their use. The public forums designated herein are referred to as “**Designated Public Forums.**” The Designated Public Forums are subject to the limitations and restrictions provided in this Section C and to those limitations and restrictions that are generally applicable to University property. All other portions of the University’s campus that are not Designated Public Forums are nonpublic forums, subject to the restrictions imposed by the University.

Designated Public Forums are open to the public generally between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. and otherwise are generally closed to all activities except for their use as pedestrian thoroughfares to access University facilities.

The University reserves the right to close or alter the conditions of use of any Designated Public Forum or any portion thereof.

### 2. Outdoor Expression

- (A) **Information Tables and Events.** The exercise of free speech or expression involving the use of information tables, other free-standing equipment, or other non-transitory socializing may be conducted in Designated Public Forums but only in a manner that does not interfere or disrupt the flow of traffic or obstruct passages, entrances and walkways.

All groups or persons who want to set up free-standing equipment must first obtain the approval of the University. Permission to set up free-standing equipment will be denied if the University believes that the equipment poses a danger to people or property. The University assumes no liability for any tables or free-standing equipment set up by non-university personnel, and as a condition of setting up a table or free-standing equipment, the persons or groups responsible accept all liability that arises from their use of tables or free-standing equipment.

Use of information tables or other non-transitory socializing on Library Walk also is subject to the Library Walk Use Policy and Procedures.

**(B) Reservations.** Reservations for activities within the Designated Public Forums are recommended but not required unless (i) the activity can reasonably be expected to attract a crowd of 10 or more people or (ii) free-standing equipment will be used. Reservations must be made at least one business day in advance of the planned activity. Reserved activities shall have priority over non-reserved activities. Events that involve 100 or more persons also are subject to PPM 510-V “Public Events: Safety and Liability.” For events or activities for which reservations are required, the registrant must identify at least one person who shall be legally and financially responsible for the event and activity (the “**Responsible Person**”). The University shall not disclose the identity of the Responsible Person unless required by law or in conjunction with efforts to hold the Responsible Person responsible for damage resulting from the event or activity. A request for reservation in a Designated Public Forum shall be granted unless:

1. A prior reservation for the same time and place exists which does not reasonably permit multiple occupancy of the Designated Public Forum or a part thereof;
2. The proposed location of the event or activity is not large enough to accommodate the crowd the activity can reasonably be expected to attract;
3. The applicant has on prior occasions damaged University property and has not paid in full for such damage;
4. The intended use or activity presents an unreasonable risk of damage to property or harm to the health or safety of the applicant or others;
5. The intended use or activity would unreasonably interfere with the orderly conduct of University functions, activities, or business; or
6. The intended use or activity would violate any applicable laws or any provision of this Policy or other University policies.

### 3. **Amplified Sound**

**(A) Permissible Use of Amplified Sound.** Unless otherwise approved by the Facility Manager, the use of sound amplification equipment is permitted only at the times and locations specified on **Exhibit A** of this Policy. Exceptions to this section may be made by the Facility Manager if it can be determined that the amplified sound will not interfere with the orderly conduct of University functions, activities and business.

- (B) **Procedures for Use of Amplified Sound.** Use of amplified sound and/or sound amplification equipment must be approved in advance by the Facility Manager and, in the case of students, must also be scheduled through the completion of the UCSD Event Calendar Form (**insert website address for form**). The maximum permissible decibel peak level is 108 dba with an average decibel level of no more than 98 dba. During any event where amplified sound is in use, the University shall have the right to require a sound check in advance of the event, and to inspect the soundboard or other amplification equipment to monitor compliance with the maximum permissible decibel limit.
  
- (C) **Noninterference with University Business or Scheduled Events.** As is the case with any expressive activity, the use of acoustic or ambient sound, such as that generated through musical instruments, and the use of sound amplification equipment otherwise permitted by this Policy may be limited when (i) such use exceeds the authorized decibel levels, (ii) otherwise violates this Policy, or (iii) unreasonably interferes with the orderly conduct of University business or authorized events.

#### 4. Political Activity

- (A) The University acknowledges and respects the rights of members of the University community as individuals to engage in personal Political Activity. However, when using University facilities, members of the University staff and faculty must keep their personal Political Activity separate from their institutional role and from University activities. Personal Political Activity should not be conducted in such a manner as to incorrectly represent University support or endorsement. Neither University funds, equipment, instructional programs or other resources may be used for such personal Political Activity.
  
- (B) Non-partisan student voter registration activities that are carried out either directly by, or under the direct supervision of and on behalf of, a campus student government or other official unit of the University may be conducted in public forums, Designated Public Forums and, with the approval of the respective Dining Services Unit Manager, in designated exterior locations near the entryways of each College Dining Commons.

## 5. Distribution and Posting of Literature

### (A) Commercial Literature

For purposes of this Policy, “**Commercial Literature**” is defined as any printed material offered for sale or distributed in association with an offering of goods or services for a fee or other consideration, with the primary purpose to generate personal, private or corporate profit that is not tax exempt under federal or state law. Personal notices (offers of personal services such as typing or tutoring and offers of secondhand goods for sale not purchased specifically for resale) posted by University students, faculty and staff shall not be considered “Commercial Literature” for purposes of this Policy.

Commercial advertising on State property is a misdemeanor (see California Penal Code Section 556). Accordingly, Commercial Literature may not be distributed or posted on University property except as listed in this Section 5(A).

- (1) Commercial Literature may be distributed in Designated Public Forums provided such distribution: (i) does not interfere with the orderly conduct of University business; (ii) is not forced upon others; and (iii) is not placed on or in parked vehicles. Persons distributing or posting Commercial Literature or any other material are responsible for ensuring that their literature does not litter the area.
- (2) Commercial Literature may be posted on the sides of the concrete kiosks identified on **Exhibit B** of this Policy which do not have designated display cases and on any vertical cement area in the Price Center not covered by tile or paint, provided that no posting is allowed within two feet of the water fountain sculpture.
- (3) Commercial Literature posted in accordance with this Policy will be removed by University facilities staff in accordance with standard removal procedures. Literature posted in violation of this Policy may be removed at any time.
- (4) Literature promoting University services may be posted with the permission of the Facility Manager.

### (B) Non-Commercial Literature

For purposes of this Policy, Non-Commercial Literature is defined as any printed material that is not Commercial Literature as defined in Section 5(A) above.

Non-Commercial Literature may be distributed by hand in Designated Public Forums provided such distribution: (i) does not interfere with the

orderly conduct of University business; (ii) is not forced upon others; and (iii) is not placed on or in parked vehicles. Non-Commercial Literature may be posted only at the locations identified in **Exhibits B & C** of this Policy and it must be posted in compliance with the procedures set forth in **Exhibit D** of this Policy. Persons distributing or posting material are responsible for ensuring that their literature does not litter the area.

(1) Designated Posting Locations

Areas identified in **Exhibit C** as “General” posting areas are open for the posting of Non-Commercial Literature. Since space in these areas is limited, persons may not post more than one item in each location, and may not remove or post over items that remain current. Certain posting areas are reserved exclusively for announcements of campus events identified in **Exhibit C** of this Policy as “Events” or as “Special Purpose” (e.g. carpool or housing information) or postings by specific groups (e.g. student government announcements). Where approval of a Facility Manager or other designated responsible party is required, such approval must be obtained prior to posting of materials. Postings must comply with any regulations or procedures described at the applicable location in addition to the procedures set forth in **Exhibit C** of this Policy.

(2) Non-Designated Locations (Outdoors/Classrooms)

Materials may only be posted in the areas identified in **Exhibits B & C** of this Policy, unless otherwise approved by the Facility Manager. No materials may be posted on the ground, trees, doors, light poles, exteriors of buildings, fences and walkways. No material may be distributed or posted in administrative buildings without the permission of the Facility Manager. Notwithstanding the foregoing, distribution of non-commercial literature in on-campus residential areas is governed by rules promulgated by each of the respective college Offices of Residential Life and all distributions in residential areas must be in accordance with rules applicable to the particular area.

(3) Student Residences

Students may post materials of their own choice inside their bedrooms or on the inside of windows provided that the materials may not interfere with the operation of doors or windows or otherwise endanger health or safety. Posting on exterior balconies, railings or walls of student residences is prohibited. All such postings must be in accordance with the UCSD Policies and

Procedures Applying to Student Activities, the rules applicable to the particular residence hall, other University Policies, and applicable law.

## 6. Activities Constituting Violations of Campus Policy

Use of all University property, including use of the Designated Public Forums, for expression or the posting and distribution of literature must be exercised in a manner compatible with the orderly conduct of University business and in compliance with the time, place and manner regulations set forth herein.

### (A) It is a violation of this Policy to:

- (1) disrupt any University function or activity;
- (2) camp or lodge on University Property;
- (3) jeopardize the safety of any person while on University property or while attending official University functions;
- (4) fail to respect the legal rights of persons who use University Property;
- or
- (5) make any person an involuntary audience or an involuntary participant of any event or activity.

For example, persons may not obstruct the egress or ingress to any UCSD facility by sitting in or in front of the doorways; or, obstruct the use of roadways, fire lanes or principle pedestrian walkways; or, prevent members of a class from hearing a lecture or taking an examination; or, prevent an instructor from giving a lecture by means of shouts or causing other interruptions; or, refuse to leave a closed meeting when unauthorized to attend; or intrude upon or refuse to leave a private interview.

- (B) Violations of this Policy should be reported to the Facility Manager or the applicable Dean of Students or the UCSD Student Conduct Coordinator.
- (C) Literature posted or distributed in violation of this Policy may be removed and persons responsible for such postings may be required to reimburse UCSD for the costs associated with such removal. Any objections to the removal of posted material must be submitted to the Facility Manager.
- (D) Persons who litter, or cause litter on, the campus may be required to reimburse UCSD for costs associated with such removal.
- (E) Students who violate this Policy may be disciplined in accordance with the UCSD Student Conduct Code, set forth in the UCSD Policies and Procedures Applying to Student Activities, Section 22.00 et seq.

- (F) Violators of this Policy may be required to leave the campus. UCSD reserves the right to pursue any and all remedies, whether identified in this Policy or not, against violators of this Policy.

### **Exhibit D** **Posting Procedures**

1. Flyers shall not exceed 11" x 17" in size and shall be limited to one of each kind per posting location. Posters shall not exceed 3' x 5' in size. Permission to post posters exceeding 3' x 5' in size may be granted by the designated UCSD official responsible for the area in question. (See **Exhibit C** for the area listings.)
2. Banners shall not exceed 10' wide x 3' high except for commercially produced banners representing UCSD campus department. Permission to post banners exceeding 10' x 3' may be granted by the designated UCSD official responsible for the area in question. (See **Exhibit C** for the area listings.) Posting of banners shall be limited to one per posting location. A facility approval stamp from the designated UCSD official responsible for the area in question (see **Exhibit C** for the area listings) is required before banners may be posted.
3. Banners, posters and flyers announcing campus events should indicate the name of the sponsoring organization or group, the nature of the event, the date and time, the location, cost (if any), and a contact number for more information.
4. No chalking is permitted on walkways, walls, or anywhere on University property or facilities.
5. Only blue painters tape or other non-destructive and removable hanging material may be used to post flyers on approved posting areas. Paste, glue, nails, and duct tape are not permitted. Staples and tacks may be used on bulletin boards.
6. All event banners, posters, and flyers announcing campus events must be removed within 48 hours after the event. Approved posting locations for non-event postings may impose reasonable time limits on postings and may require postings to clearly identify their expiration date.
7. No flyers, announcements, or literature of any kind may be placed on automobiles (e.g., under windshield wipers) in campus parking lots.
